Message from NCDMV Regarding the New Moped Registration Law

On July 1, 2015, House Bill 1145 went into effect. This bill requires that citizens register with the DMV and display a valid license plate on any moped that is operated on NC roads. (Note: These vehicles will not be titled in NC.) As when any new law goes in effect, there is an "adjustment" period during which citizens become familiar with the requirements of the law and how to comply.

While the Division is continuing to inform and educate citizens about the new law, please consider issuing warning tickets, if appropriate, rather than a citation during the first thirty days the law is in effect.

Working together, the Division and you as law enforcement officers can promote an orderly and customer-friendly transition to compliance with the new law.

We are working with DMV-License & Theft Bureau to create an online course for law enforcement officers. We will let you know when it is ready.
