Accreditation Assessment Team Invites Public Comment on NC Justice Academy

Salemburg: A team of assessors from the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc. (CALEA), will arrive in Salemburg on November 7, 2016 to examine all aspects of the North Carolina Justice Training Academy, Director Mark Strickland announced today. The Academy's performance will be assessed in nine basic areas: Credentialing; Organization; Direction and Authority; Human Resources; Recruitment, Selection, Employment, and Promotion; Instructional Systems; Training Administration; Instructors; and Students.

Verification by the assessment team that the North Carolina Justice Training Academy meets the commission's high standards is part of a voluntary process to maintain CALEA Accreditation - a highly prized recognition of professional excellence.

As part of the on-site assessment, academy employees, state law enforcement agencies, the law enforcement training community, other state agencies, and the public are invited to offer comments by calling 910-525-3389 on Tuesday, November 8, 2016, from 2 PM to 4 PM. Comments will be taken by the Assessment Team.

Telephone comments are limited to 10 minutes and must address the academy's ability to comply with CALEA's standards.
