The Reflections Child Abuse & Neglect
Symposium offers a multi-disciplinary
training opportunity for child abuse
professionals. Geared for professionals
involved within a multi-disciplinary team
(MDT) as part of the children's advocacy
center (CAC) model, this training allows for
discipline-specific and/or cross-training of
professionals in the investigation,
evaluation, treatment and prosecution of
child maltreatment cases.

OBJECTIVES:

At the conclusion of this educational activity,
the participant should be able to:

1. Recognize and describe the ways in
which child abuse professionals (from their
various disciplines) collaborate to make
the investigation, evaluation and
prosecution of child maltreatment cases
stronger and more efficient.
2. Apply knowledge and skills to improve
the multi-disciplinary response of child
abuse professionals in the investigation,
evaluation, treatment and prosecution of
child maltreatment cases.

Before joining SEARCH in 2012, Mr. Fitzsimmons worked for the National District Attorneys Association, where he was Senior Attorney for its National Center for Prosecution of Child Abuse beginning in 2009.

Jim Sears has been a law enforcement officer for over 30 years working with the Irving Police Department (TX) where he retired as a sergeant, serving 17 years in the Domestic Violence and Child Abuse Unit. A dedicated advocate of children, he currently serves as a law enforcement consultant/instructor with the Shaken Baby Alliance for the Serious Physical Child Abuse and SIDS Program, Texas Commission on Law Enforcement instructor specializing in Domestic Violence and Child Abuse, Instructor at the Crimes Against Children's Conference in Dallas, is a Certified Instructor for Advanced Child Abuse Investigations through the Texas Municipal Police Association, instructor for the Gundersen National Child Protection Training Center and National Criminal Justice Training Center. Sears is the 2011 recipient of the Lt. Bill Walsh Award from the Dallas Children's Advocacy Center for career achievements in the field of child abuse investigations. He frequently lectures on topics related to child abuse investigations, interview and interrogation, and crime scene investigations for domestic violence and child abuse.

ANTOINETTE L. LASKEY, MD, MPH, MBA FAAP



Dr. Laskey is an Associate Professor and Division Chief of the Center for Safe and Healthy Families at the University of Utah. Dr. Laskey's clinical interests relate to the evaluation and management of the potentially abused child. Her research interests include cognitive errors in decision making related to child maltreatment, child fatalities and prevention programs related to unsafe sleep practices and child abuse.


