

Methodist University is proud to announce the expansion of the Master of Justice Administration (MJA) program to western North Carolina. The MJA program is now offered at the North Carolina Justice Academy (NCJA) campus at Salemburg and **starting in January 2014 will be offered at the NCJA Edneyville campus.**

The MJA program prepares criminal justice professionals to assume leadership roles within their agencies and/or teach criminal justice courses at the undergraduate level. The program provides flexibility by allowing students to enter in either the fall or spring semester. The MJA program offers a combination of weekend residencies at either the Salemburg or Edneyville campuses or online participation between residency sessions. Most students choose to take two classes per semester; however, students may take only one class if desired. In addition, students may take up to nine credit hours without formal application to the program.

The MJA program meets the unique needs of working criminal justice professionals who otherwise would not be able to commit to a traditional program.
