

Travel paths to the Salemburg Campus (as of 10-12-2016):

From Fayetteville and the western part of NC:

Autryville Road between Autryville and Salemburg is closed due to the bridge being swept away. You will need to follow NC24 to Roseboro and then take 242 to Salemburg for the safest route. *Follow any state posted detours along the way.* NC 24 is open from Fayetteville, through Clinton, but is closed prior to reaching Turkey from Clinton. The road has caved in on both sides of the major bridge.

From Clinton and Wilmington:

Bonnettsville Road between Salemburg and Clinton is closed. The roadway was washed away and took 2 cars with people inside into the swamp just outside of Salemburg. If you are traveling from Clinton you will need to take Bonnettsville road, turn right onto Zoar Church Road, and go until they turn onto 242 at Salem Pizza and come into Salemburg. Bearskin Road is closed due to trees and power poles laying in the roadway, so that is not an option coming from Clinton the back way. At last report, a sink hole developed on Laurel Lake Road, and another portion has caving occurring underneath it as well. So stay off of Laurel Lake Rd between Salemburg and White Woods Rd.

From Raleigh and the western part of NC:

NC 242 is open from Benson to Salemburg, except for a small section where half the road has washed away. DOT still has it open. I40 eastbound lanes are open from Raleigh to Wilmington, but the westbound lanes are closed between Newton Grove and Benson because both lanes were completely washed away.

From Columbus County (Whiteville, NC):

Most major roads in Columbus are closed due to flooding and bridges being washed out. 701 at Western Prong is closed and will be for months, as a section roughly 125' caved in and collapsed. 74/76 is flooded with several sections caved in as well.

It is strongly recommended that you not travel **AT ALL** on any secondary road south of Garland to Harrells, and use extreme caution even if on a major roadway at the south end of our county. Flood waters just crested down there yesterday, and water rescues by boat and aircraft were happening as recent as yesterday down there.

If you are in doubt of the best route to Salemburg, please utilize the state roadway closure automated service by **dialing 511 on your cell phone**. You can also access interactive maps by going to the NCDOT website, but there may be a delay in posting to both of those databases by DOT.
