CAREER SURVIVAL: Opioid Overdose Death Investigation and Prosecution Training

Instructor: William "Bill" Loucks Jr

Lesson Purpose: To offer students the knowledge to conduct death investigations revolving around opioid overdoses and

To provide students the knowledge to prosecute cases related to opioid overdoses.

Training Goals/Objective: The course will cover basic drug overdose death investigation techniques, discuss legal requirements and issues involved in drug overdose death investigations, address drug safety awareness to heroin and fentanyl, and highlight proper evidence handling and protocols.

Topics to be covered include:

- Changing the mindset from accident to homicide
- Responding to and investigating drug overdose deaths
- What to look for in the way of evidence
- Documenting the death scene
- Electronic evidence: cell phones, social media and more
- Witness and suspect interview techniques
- Search and seizure issues
- Legal theory and case development
- Intelligence gathering and sharing
- Officer safety when dealing with drugs like fentanyl
- Case analysis

CAREER SURVIVAL: Community Policing Before the Crisis

Lesson Purpose: To increase the awareness of one's own micro-aggressions in everyday life. Improve police-community relations by teaching ways to develop authentic relationships between the police and the community

- Explain implicit biases.
- Identify stakeholders and the roles they play in a successful community policing initiative.

Lesson Purpose: This course will provide law enforcement officers and other personnel with the necessary psycho-social skills needed to effectively mitigate conflicts and build trust with ethnic minorities

Training Goals/Objective: At the end of this block of instruction, the participant will be able to achieve the following objectives in accordance with the information presented during the instructional period:

- Understand how cultural biases play a role in policing.
- Identify the impact of racial profiling.
- Explain the differences between stereotyping, prejudice, and discrimination.
- Understand the Seven Social Processes that lead to Lucifer Effect.
- Understand Kant's ethical theories of hypothetical and categorical imperatives.
- Identify methods of building trust and meaningful relationships with minority populations.
- Explain the concept of police legitimacy and procedural justice.
- Identify ways to increase perceptions of police fairness, legitimacy, and effectiveness.
- Understand the Five Factors that affect citizens' attitudes toward the police.
- Discuss the barriers to good police-community relations.
- Understand the significance of using de-escalation techniques.
